Samling Timber (Samling) officially handed over a clinic and living quarters to the community of Long Sukang recently, after completing the construction of new facilities and receiving its certification from the Ministry of Health Malaysia and the Sarawak State Health Department.

A well functional clinic and quarters goes a long way in ensuring the health and safety of residents in Long Sukang and nearby villages, as well as the well-being of the medical practitioners in this area.”
